1. The instant bail application has been filed under Section 483 BNSS on behalf of accused-applicant. The accused-applicant was arrested in connection with FIR No. 282/2025 registered at Police Station Kotwali District Bharatpur for the offence(s) under Sections 309(4) of BNS.

2. Learned counsel for the accused-applicant submits that the applicant is a young boy aged 19 years. It is submitted that co-accused have been enlarged on bail by learned trial Court. It is also submitted that applicant is in custody ever since 15.08.2025 and charge-sheet has been filed. It is further submitted that out of five criminal antecedents, applicant has been acquitted in four offences. Learned counsel further submits that the conclusion of





trial is likely to take a long time and no useful purpose would be served by keeping the applicant behind bars till disposal of the case.

3. *Per contra*, learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

4. Having heard the arguments advanced by the learned counsel for the parties and considering the fact that accused-applicant is a young boy of 19 years; that co-accused have been enlarged on bail by learned trial Court; that accused-applicant is in custody ever since 15.08.2025; that charge-sheet has been filed and looking to the overall facts and circumstances of the case and material on record but without commenting on merits/demerits of the case, this court is inclined to allow the bail application of the accused-applicant and enlarge him on bail.

5. Accordingly, the bail application under Section 483 BNSS is allowed and it is ordered that accused-applicant **Dhan Singh Faujdar S/o Ramu Singh** shall be enlarged on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of learned trial Judge for his appearance before the court concerned on all the dates of hearing as and when called upon to do so.
